Message from the Leadership Team (LT)

Oh to be young again with little to worry about and freedom to just grab opportunities as they present themselves. But as I've gotten older, there is more often than not a price to pay and a decision whether it is worth it. Season 1 of The Chosen (come join us every other Thursday evening to watch here at Trinity) has shown me how the disciples were presented with an opportunity to follow Jesus, some sacrificing the (secure) life they knew for something completely unknown (at the time). For others, it was easier, leaving a life of baggage at the roadside and beginning again, freed from it. But still, whilst they had Jesus walking with them, they perhaps didn't have the same Jesus as we have walking beside us when we face similar crossroads. We know Jesus died for our sins and lives forever, but for them, he would have just been a rabbi (teacher) sent by God to deliver His people from those oppressing them (Romans at that time) - it would be another 3-4 years of learning, watching, understanding before they (sort of) got it!

Fortunately, by their testimony's in the Gospels, and those after them to inspire and encourage His Way, Truth and Life (New Testament), we can understand what it means to have Jesus in our life far quicker (although the learning never stops). It will comfort us, especially when we face life's crossroads and are unsure of the direction to travel. He will be there no matter what, guiding us (when we look), giving courage (when needed), nudging us to better places, closing doors when He knows it's not right. And all this, just by faith. Pray for yourself, and things happen if it is His will - just be patient.

So whatever is happening in your life, be it a crossroads, a roundabout, a fork in the road, or just straight on, keep Jesus walking beside you, and He will direct you when you ask - just remember to listen.

Circuit Announcement 19th June 2025

The Circuit Leadership Team wish to update you in relation to ministerial staffing in the Wey Valley Methodist Circuit.

Reverend George Quarm's appointment to the Circuit expires in summer 2026 and he has informed us that he will not be seeking a reinvitation; instead he will be entering the Stationing process for another post and we wish him well in that.

2026 will mark the completion of 40 years' active ministry by Reverend Paul Glass and his appointment to the Circuit expires in summer 2027 when he plans to retire. The Circuit Stewards greatly appreciate the skill and energy Paul has devoted to his role in the Circuit but recognise this has placed considerable pressure on him.

To ease this pressure and prepare for the transition to retirement, Paul wishes to relinquish the role of Superintendent as from September 2026 and spend his final year in the Circuit working half-time.

To achieve this reduction in hours, Paul would step back to pastoral charge of Cranleigh and Guildford St. Mary's, together with some continuing University Chaplaincy work. He will continue in pastoral charge of Knaphill through to August 2026 but then hand over that role and step down as Superintendent.

The proposed change in Paul's time commitment has been discussed and agreed with the Chair of the South East District and is subject to confirmation by the Circuit Meeting to be held on 10 July.

This autumn the Circuit will therefore be entering the Stationing process to seek a new minister to serve as Superintendent from September 2026. We regret that the financial constraints, the reduced overall membership of the churches in the Circuit and the limited number of ministers available for stationing make it inevitable that our ministerial staffing level reduces by one minister. This will take us from the current level of 5 down to 4. Sam Funnell's one-third commitment to the District as Assistant Chair effectively reduces this to 3.7.

Adapting to this reduction will cause uncertainties and many challenges. We will be consulting closely with Circuit churches and are exploring initiatives to lessen the impact of the change. Having Paul Glass in place half-time for 2026-7 helps us by phasing the reduction over 2 years.

This will give us a little more breathing space to work with Paul, the new Superintendent and other team members to consider how our ministerial resources should best be used going forward.

Please feel free to discuss this with any Circuit Steward but in the meantime we ask for your prayers for all involved in this process.
