I remember when I was a teenager (probably more than 20 years ago now!), on holiday at a Methodist Guild Holiday Centre, sitting at the evening dinner table with others about my age, listening awestruck to a recently retired Minister who was hosting the holiday. Without any script or prompt, he told us the story of the Old Testament including the greatness of Moses.

Fresh from the Word this week is based around the book of Hebrews and whoever wrote Hebrews (it might be Paul, but it might not!) is claiming that Jesus is greater than Moses. For the Hebrews of the time, that must have been pretty hard to take for Moses had led the Israelites out of oppression in Egypt and was their leader for many years. He produced the Commandments; he regularly conveyed messages from God; he parted the Red Sea and found water in a rock etc etc. How can Jesus be greater than that?

We know the answer to that, Jesus is God's son whilst Moses was a prophet and leader, and so we look to Jesus rather than Moses. Jesus gives us so much, a place of comfort, of sustenance and He knows and loves each one of us dearly and consistently. He actually gave his life for us!

Middle East emergency appeal : match funding offer

Whilst the severe restrictions on aid getting into Gaza have hampered many aid organisations, Christian Aid is continuing to respond to the deepening humanitarian crisis. Its partner agencies are deeply rooted in the

communities they serve and are continuing to reach those in greatest need with food, clean water, medical care, education and safe shelter. Since October 2023 more than 800,000 people have been reached with emergency aid, more than 1.3 million people supported with food and more than 950,000 with water and sanitation.

Christian Aid continues to appeal for support, which for most of us can only be done through financial donations. In that connection they have recently announced that an anonymous supporter is currently matching all donations to the Gaza response pound for pound, up to £100,000.
